Vision

The Health Outcomes Core (HOC) was established in September, 2010 with the following vision: by the end of FY2016, HOC will be a self-sustaining organization conducting research that contributes to the improvement of healthcare, and that drives the national mental health policy debate to focus on integrated patient care and to promote mental health parity. Within the outcomes research field, HOC will develop a collaborative network of national and international researchers and achieve national recognition as a leading mentoring center for the development of health outcomes researchers. This report provides an update on our progress toward realizing our Vision.


- 1. Conduct applied health research resulting in publication of new knowledge to improve the delivery of health care.

Executive Summary

During the shortened fiscal year 2014, the Health Outcomes Core of CAHR (HOC) continued to increase its overall productivity on standard academic research metrics, in addition to enhancing the quality of reputation of its collective work. Besides the aforementioned productivity information further detailed below, Drs. Copeland, Zeber, Stock and affiliated colleagues have enhanced the research reputation of Baylor Scott & White Health through roles and contributions to local, national and international organizations. Publications in high impact journals like *JAMA*, *Psychiatric Services*, and *British Journal of Medicine* were supplemented by oral presentations and featured workshops at major scientific conferences. Dr. Jinadatha testified before a congressional subcommittee regarding our team's work in addressing infectious disease, and his submission was selected as the outstanding abstract at the recent APIC meeting. Dr. Copeland continues to represent Baylor Scott & White on the HMORN governance board, while Dr. Zeber remains chair of the VA's Institutional Review Board. Both senior investigators serve on national advisory boards, invited working groups, editorial boards and site leads for national research networks. We look forward to continuing our service and commitment to both institutions while further developing what we believe are important multifaceted missions.



The HOC is one of three major work groups within CAHR and works cooperatively with colleagues such as Dr. Basu in the Center for Aging and Care (A Stevens, Director) and the Community Research Center for Senior Health (A Stevens, Director).





Summary: Thanks to the efforts of HOC investigators and our junior researchers, 11 manuscripts were in submission as of the end of FY14 in addition to the 22 papers accepted (two others accepted after close of FY). Of special note is that the *Greenawalt* et al. publication received a special recommendation from the VA's Health Services Research & Development office for recognition to senior leadership for its important contribution and implications for improving clinical care.



Other Service Activities & Accomplishments

In addition, HOC investigators contributed in numerous ways to the research and academic missions of their institutions, as well as serving as representatives to local, national and international research entities. They have contributed their expertise to numerous organizations, and were also honored for their roles on various working groups, advisory boards, and special committees. These activities include:

- providing 31 sessions of methodological consulting for VA and Baylor Scott & White clinical colleagues to support of projects (primarily Dr. Stock, with others from Drs. Copeland and Zeber)
- donating time to peer review for 34 manuscripts for journals, peer review of 6 sets of conference abstracts, and peer review in 4 grant proposal review sessions; Dr. Copeland was also appointed to a 4-year term on the Scientific Merit Review Board for VHA Rehabilitation Research & Development Service
- Dr. Zeber has served as Chair of the VA Institutional Review Board since 201; Drs. Copeland Stock are committee members, and lead the data security working group
- Dr. Copeland served as VA Interim Associate Chief of Staff for 11 months of FY13-FY14
- Dr. Zeber is a member of the International Medication Adherence working group (ISPOR), and led a recent study and systematic review publication.
- Drs. Copeland and Zeber serve on the national Academy Health Advisory Board for the Comorbidities and Behavioral special interest groups, respectively

Exciting New/Developing Areas of Research and Collaboration

Infectious Disease, Women's Health, Patient-Centered Outcomes

Baylor Scott & White will be involved in a research proposal to be submitted to the Patient-Centered Outcomes Research Institute (PCORI) and future projects with Dr. Karen Brust as Co-Investigator. This collaboration represents an expansion of our work and continuing efforts with Dr. Chetan Jinadatha, a VA-affiliated investigator, and his growing team. We will continue to develop papers and abstracts associated with Dr. Jinadatha's Xenex grant and other related infectious disease prevention projects. In a related, ongoing VA-funded project (Zeber - PI, Copeland - Co-I), Dr. Zeber's study of disinfection of hospital rooms involves four facilities and the implementation of an innovative ultraviolet technology to reduce the incidence, mortality and treatment costs association with hospital acquired infections (including MRSA, C.difficile). Drs. Zeber, Copeland, and Jinadatha, with the recent addition of Dr. Eileen Stock as statistical consultant, are gathering data from multiple sources including device usage, infection control reports, administrative data, and staff observations to evaluate the practical benefits of this novel technology. The study team will also soon pursue a multisite VA project under the Cooperative Studies Program (CSP). HOC has arranged a more official affiliate investigator status for Dr. Jinadatha consistent with his productive and clinically important research trajectory. In another area of endeavor, Dr. Zeber is developing his role as site lead in the VA Women's Practice-Based Research Network (VA PBRN-Women) which conducts both quality assessment and research projects. Dr. Zeber's submission to a call for VA PBRN-Women projects was the first selected for implementation as quality assessment of women's care in the VA (10 sites). He is also PI of a subsequent research project under review for funding, and is coordinating an Operations quality improvement project sponsored by VA central office to be conducted at the Central Texas VA, examining women veteran perceptions of the Affordable Care Act and limitation in state Medicaid expansion.
